Dear Members of the Congregation of Trinity Reformed UCC,

I want to begin by thanking you all for opening your fellowship hall to the community for rental. The space has served us well in hosting the semi-annual women's clothing swap!

I would like to take this opportunity to not only briefly explain the history and structure of the clothing swap to you all, but to also extend the invitation to the members of your congregation to join in the fun!

In 2009 I was working as a case manager for young adults diagnosed with serious mental health issues. Part of this job included accessing community resources, such as clothing banks, to meet the basic needs of these young adults. I found that while the local clothing banks were able to meet the basic clothing needs of these young adults, I found that the clothing was all suited for a much older crowd. I was inspired then to host my very first clothing swap and donate the leftover clothing to Corner of Hope Clothing Bank in Leola, the clothing bank I used most frequently.

The first clothing swap had five attendees and was held in a spare bedroom in my home. Since that time, it expanded to the basement with more than forty attendees, and has now grown into your fellowship hall! We have donated hundreds of pounds of clothing to Corner of Hope, now affiliated with Conestoga Valley Christian Community Services (CVCCS), since the first swap and we look forward with being able to continue to donate hundreds of pounds more!

The next clothing swap is scheduled to be held on Saturday, April 29 from 12:00p-3:00pm at your church. Admission will be \$5.00 for those identifying as TRUCC members. Here is how the swap works:

- -Bring clean, unwanted and unworn women's clothing (Our definition of "women's clothing" is loose. If someone identifying as a woman has worn it, it's women's clothing.) that is still in good, wearable condition to the church on the day of the swap. Plus size clothing (size 10+) is encouraged! Shoes, purses, and accessories are also welcome. If you are low on clothing donations, please do not hesitate to attend.
- -You will be responsible for sorting your clothing by type and size. There will be signs to direct you. Most times there are plenty of swappers ready to help with sorting!
- -Dig through, try on and take clothing with you that you are now the proud owner of!
- -Leftover clothing will be donated to the clothing bank at CVCCS in Lancaster County.
- -If you are so inspired, bring a friend and bring a snack to share!

Thank you so much for reading about the clothing swap! I look forward to it growing with you!
