
Offering envelopes have arrived! They are ready to be distributed and will be on the table in the Narthex for pick-up.

TRINITY REFORMED UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST FEBRUARY 18, 2020 EXECUTIVE TEAM MEETING MINUTES

Call to Order by Mark

Prayer by Esther. Sharon volunteered for March meeting.

Executive Team members present: MarkCote, Sharon Smaling, Kathy Jones, Marilyn Shertzer, Esther Markey, plus Pastor Patty Dodds and George Himpsl.

Review and Approval of January 2020 Minutes. After minor corrections, Esther moved to accept and Sharon seconded approval of the January Minutes.

President's Report. Mark shared his discussion with Conference regarding the official vote for calling Pastor Patty at the February Congregational Meeting, February 23, 2020. Since Pastor Patty was going to Conference to pick up Labyrinth she volunteered to pick up the official ballots that need to be used. Mark following up on ensuring a representative would be present on February 23rd. Installation will be later. Date to be determined. Patty's Call Agreement was amended to include a Pastoral Relations Committee.

Treasurer's Report. Mark moved to approve the Treasurer's Report and Esther seconded the motion.

Pastor's Report. Preparing for Lenten Retreat, Feb 22nd and Ash Wednesday, Feb 26th.

She presented Agenda for February Congregational Meeting to include:

Looking ahead, Pastor Patty requested to take a week's vacation April 13-19.

Sexton Report. George reported that he is working on interior walls. Seeking quotes for Steeple painting. Discussed announcing that our Rummage Sale collection of items would be same as that noted by Community Aid. George will put out flyers and announce in church. Marilyn then updated everyone on our relationship with Community Aid and the availability of \$25. Cash cards for use at Community Aid by needy persons. We are eligible for \$300 in cards every three months as long as we request them quarterly. The church is also eligible now to apply for a \$5,000 grant for a mission project.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: BEHAVIORAL COVENANT FOR TRUCC

Marilyn offered a proposal based on our mission statement posted on our TRUCC website combined with suggestions from a handout on "behavioral covenants for congregations." Discussion ensued whether there was a need for a specific action to resolve disputes. After consideration the group determined that based on our recent study we are being called to stretch ourselves toward love, radical hospitality and inclusion and thus offer the following proposal (Incl 1) for the congregation's consideration at the February Congregational Meeting and to be discussed and voted on at the April Meeting,

Kathy made a Motion to adjourn and Esther seconded it.

TRINITY REFORMED UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST CONGREGATIONAL MEETING, FEBRUARY 23, 2020

Call to Order by President Mark Cote. Mark called attention to the 2019 Annual Report and his remarks therein as well as the work of many others recorded there as well.

Fruitfulness Project – Pastor Patty shared the workings of several groups who have met so far:

Extreme Generosity Group

has decorated a glass jar for donations to Helping Hands during Lent.

Recommending 10% of each of our fundraisers go toward a charity.

Passionate Worship – Preparing Sanctuary for Ash Wednesday

Risk Taking Mission and Service

Establishing a supportive relationship with Hershey Mills

Working on making a Community Prayer Box for prayer requests from the greater community.

Supporting Call to Care

The other two groups, Radical Hospitality and Faith Development have not met yet.

Pastor Patty then asked for a list of charities that the Congregation wished to support as part of our ten fundraisers.

Church World Service in Lancaster County (helps refugees)

Columbia Food Bank

Aaron's Acres (a camp for Autistic children)

Fire Department

Then Eileen Himpsl suggested we keep one opening for an emergency need. Marilyn Shertzer proposed holding the Foodbank until last since they received January's fundraiser donation so as to be used for the emergency. Then Adella Houck said any emergency could come out of the Helping Hands Fund. Chuck Romberger raised our current missions like Mercy Home. He then suggested that the list which was now longer

than 10 go back to committee for resubmission for final approval.

Prayer Requests – Pastor Patty then raised concern about privacy when requesting prayer request during the service since we were on line and had no control over who might be listening. It was suggested to ask for permission to ask for prayer on someone's behalf and only use first names. Prayer requests can be given to Pastor Patty or put in her box, she can filter as she relays.

Good Practices – Behavioral Covenant – Pastor Patty passed out a Proposal for a TRUCC Behavioral Covenant. The congregation was asked to read and review. We will discuss and talk about it at our next congregational meeting in April. (see Covenant on next page)

Pastor Patty offered these words from Romans 12 at her calling





STRASBURG RAILROAD TICKETS


